### Maths

In maths, we have been looking measurement. We have compared different lengths and heights both inside and outside the classroom. We have used sentence starters and different language to explain our learning. We have used ordinal words to order objects and numbers.

### Reading

Just a note to remind parents that book bags should be brought to school on your child's reading day and will be returned the following day. The new reading diaries are super fun and include all the phonic sounds and high frequency words. Please use the reading diary to provide feedback on your child's learning too!

### Phonics

The children are enjoying their guided phonics session – they will tend to work on the same sound each week. On the school website you will find the 3 speed sets – you could use these to recap the sounds your child has already learnt.




