Maths


In maths, we have been looking at number bonds again – the children are becoming so much more fluent with their number facts. We looked at different ways of presenting our number bonds and how we could use our number bonds to ten to help us with bigger number problems.

Reading

Just a note to remind parents that book bags should be brought to school on your child's reading day and will be returned the following day. As we move through the year you may notice some repetition with the phonics books – this is a chance for the children to consolidate certain sounds at home. Please record your child's home reading in their reading diary each week.

Phonics

The children are enjoying their guided phonics session – they will tend to work on the same sound each week. On the school website you will find the 3 speed sets – you could use these to recap the sounds your child has already learnt. Your child could also look for their weekly sound in different places at home e.g. **ar** – **car**.
