We have had another busy week full of learning in Year One.

English

We continued to explore our book "Dear Bear." We talked about adjectives to describe how the characters were feeling and practised writing letters. We then planned out an alternative version of the story before writing it.

Maths

In maths, we have been talking about money and looking at the values of different coins. We have been using the coins to make amounts of money and the children all loved role playing shops, where they were able to buy and sell items with their friends.

Reading

The children have now finished their second week of "The Big Read" and are really enjoying sharing their reading skills with friends. We have been reading "Giraffes Can't Dance" and working on a variety of different reading skills.

Just a note to remind parents that book bags should be brought to school on your child's reading day/ book change day and will be returned the following day. You may notice some repetition with the phonics books – this is a chance for the children to consolidate certain sounds at home. Please record your child's home reading in their reading diary each week.

Phonics

The children are enjoying their guided phonics session – they will tend to work on the same sound each week. On the school website you will find the 3 speed sets – you could use these to recap the sounds your child has already learnt. Your child could also look for their weekly sound in different places at home e.g. $\mathbf{ar} - \mathbf{car}$.
