English

Maths

In maths, we have started learning about multiplication. We made arrays which show us how many objects are in a group, and how many groups there are. We used these arrays to help us work out number sentences.

Reading

The children are continuing to enjoy their “Big Read” sessions. This week we started the book “The Problem with Penguins.”

Just a note to remind parents that book bags should be brought to school on your child’s reading day/ book change day and will be returned the following day. You may notice some repetition with the phonics books – this is a chance for the children to consolidate certain sounds at home. Please record your child’s home reading in their reading diary each week.

Phonics


