Pupils agree to:

- try their best with their learning and be resilient;
- follow the school's Positive Code of Conduct and understand the rewards and consequences of behaviour;
- recognise that school values support kindness, empathy and tolerance;
- understand the consequences of bullying and report any incidence to a trusted adult;
- tell a member of staff if they are worried about anything;
- be considerate for the feelings, ideas and beliefs of others;
- be responsible and respectful in the use of computing and mobile technology when publishing images, emails and texts, protecting passwords and not divulging contact details.
