Learn about the chicks in the spring song Épisode 4	<i>Les poussins naissent. Cui-cui cui-cui cui-cui cui-cui cui !</i>	The chicks hatch/are born. Peep peep peep peep peep peep peep!	Beware to only pronounce the <i>e</i> sound, in <i>poussent</i> , not the <i>-nt</i> , as they are silent in verbs.	Who is the mother of the "poussin" ? Listen to this song to remind yourself.
	<i>dix, onze, douze, treize, quatorze, quinze, seize, dix-sept, dix- huit, dix-neuf, vingt</i>	Numbers 10-20 What do numbers between 11 and 16 have in common in French? They all buzz and finish with the <i>-ze</i> sound. After that, it's just the pattern of 10-7 for 17, 10-8 for 18, 10-9 for 19!	Children who are at writing level, they can colour-code the French words above to recall phonics and the link between the sound and the written according to which phase they have learnt. Phase 1 covered from Yr1 at St Jérôme and Yr3 at Rhodes Avenue: <i>a, e, i, o, u</i> Phase 2 covered from Yr2 at St Jérôme and Yr4 at Rhodes Avenue: <i>au, an/am/en/em, on/om, ai, eau</i> Further codes <i>é, è, ê, ë, e + 2 consonants, un, oi, ur</i>	 Adults: let your child explain them to you.
