Activity 1: the sound U

Do you remember how we pronounce the vowels (a,e,i,o,) in French?

a est fuchsia, e est bleu, i est gris. o est jaune

today we are going to learn that u est prune !

The word "prune" in French is the noun for plum in English and also to describe a plum colour.

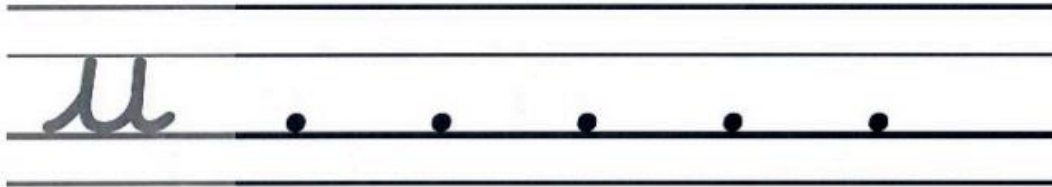
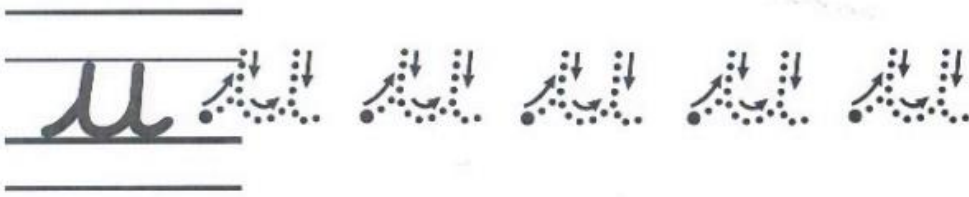

Activity 1

Trace le u en prune



Lulu est sur la lune.



L.I. to trace the letter "u" in French, know it's sound and colour it.

Note: Some "e" letters in nouns stay in black, like the final e in a word, as it is not pronounced in the same way as the e that is coloured in *bleu*.

a, e, i, o, u

A, a, a J'aime le chocolat.

E, e, e Je n'aime pas les oeufs.

I, i, i J'aime beaucoup le riz.

O, o, o J'aime aussi les gateaux.

U, u, u Je n'aime pas la laitue.
