It is a bilingual course featuring lively and enjoyable video and audio materials, activity sheets and challenges to encourage pupils to develop their confidence in speaking and understanding French. Please ask your parents to create an account, the enrolment is free. We highly recommend that you explore this site with your parents (and your siblings) and learn French alongside with them. Remember to always have parental supervision when you are on the internet.

You can also decide that each time you are going to say a number in English, to say it in French instead! Playing with French numbers is fun to do as a family.

We recommend this course to you, because we think the bilingual videos are a lovely way to keep the French language alive in your home. If you wish, you can watch the previous Video Lessons and listen to the Radio Shows for consolidation of previous learning. You can also go ahead in the learning if you wish.

Don't do all the activities in one go! It's better for your long-term memory that you practise French a few times a week.
