Remember to always have parental supervision when you are on the internet and don't do the two activities in one go. It is better for your long-term memory that you practise French a few times a week.

Activity 1:

Watch the [Lesson 24 – Merci beaucoup](#).

Reading the [Vocabulary List](#) can help you with deeper understanding and learning and to do the [Activity 24 a](#).

Did you notice the difference between “s’il te plaît” and “s’il vous plaît” ?

They both mean please. “S’il **te** plaît” is used when talking informally to a friend or an adult you know well, such as your Mum or Dad. “S’il **vous** plaît” is used when talking formally to more than one person, or an adult you don't know.

Activity 2:

Listen to the [Radio Show 24](#) to revise yesterday's words.

As a challenge you can practise using the French words “s’il te plaît” and “ merci “ with your family at home.

Did you spot the accent on the letter i in “plaît”? It's pretty isn't it? Do English letters have accents on them?

Remember that at all times you can sing along to French songs you have learnt in Yr2 chosen from the Rhodes Avenue [Yr2 Pinterest Board](#) and listen to stories in [French Stories](#).
