



Bonjour les enfants ! Comment ça va ?

This week we have planned 2 activities for you to learn about the days of the week in French!

Remember: Don't do the two activities in one go! It's better for your long-term memory that you practise French a few times a week.

Activity 1:

Watch the video [Lesson 14 - Les jours de la semaine](#), and read the [Vocabulary List](#).

I was wondering if you remember how to write the date in French like we did in class:

Lundi 22 juin

Do you remember that the days of the week and the months of the year are common nouns in French? That's why they don't begin with a capital letter. Of course, there is a capital letter if these nouns are used at the beginning of a sentence like:

Vendredi 26 juin

As an extension, you can do the [Activity 14 a](#). Please print it in black and white.

Activity 2:

Listen to the [Radio Show 14](#) to review the days and the week and complete the [Activity 14 b](#). Please print it in black and white.

In the same way you did it with numbers and colours, you can practise your French even when no-one else is around. For the next days, try to say and write the date in French.

As an extension you might wish to watch [Papo](#) visiting a French school: can you spot the French teacher "maîtresse" writing the date on the black board? Which day of the week is she writing ?
