

We would like you to carry on recalling French learning with the bilingual course called [High-Five](#).

Activity 1

Watch the [Video Lesson 9- le jardin](#). Reading the [Notes for teachers 9](#) can help you with deeper understanding and learning and to do the [Activity 9 a](#).

Activity 2

Listen to the [Radio Show 9](#) to revise yesterday's words.

Then read [Vocabulary List](#) and do the [Activity 9b](#).

Can you spot in the vocabulary list which nouns are feminine, which ones are masculine?

In front of a masculine noun, like "canard" if you want to say "a duck", you use the masculine determiner "un" to say "un canard".

In front of a feminine noun, like "araignée" if you want to say "a spider", you use the feminine determiner "une" to say "une araignée". Remember, what is the word origin of araignée? The same as in English: Arachne in Latin.

Extension

We wonder whether you could say and write a French sentence describing a garden like we did in class:

Dans le jardin, il y a une fleur, un arbre et un banc.

Then you can add some adjectives of colours in your sentence. At this stage, make sure you only describe masculine nouns using their adjectives in the masculine form or if you wish to use a feminine noun, make sure you use colours that have already got a final e like "rouge, jaune, orange, rose."

Dans le jardin, il y a une fleur rose, un arbre vert et un banc bleu. We would love you to draw the description.

If you can, don't do all the activities in one go! It is better for your long-term memory that you practise French a few times a week.
