If you can, don't do all the activities in one go! It is better for your long-term memory that you practise French a few times a week.

Activity 1

I was wondering if you remember how to write the date in French like we did in class: *"Lundi 29 juin"*

Do you remember that the days of the week and the months of the year are common nouns in French? That's why they don't begin with a capital letter. Of course, there is a capital letter if these nouns are used at the beginning of a sentence like:

"Vendredi 3 juillet"

In addition to the Original illustrations by Saint-Exupéry will be presented, as well as live drawings by innovative calligrapher Alice Mazzilli inspired by the readings.

This exceptional event marks the 75th anniversary of the end of WWII, and the 120th anniversary of the birth of Antoine de Saint-Exupéry.
