









COVID Outbreak Contingency Plan – Sept – 2021

<p>When should my child self-isolate or miss school?</p> 	 <p>No</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All children MUST attend school unless they are ill or have an authorised absence From 16th August 2021, children under 18 (or double vaccinated adults) do not need to self-isolate or miss school if a member of their household or a contact, has COVID. Instead, they will need to book a PCR test and continue coming into school so long as they have no symptoms and the test is negative.
	 <p>Yes</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> If your child develops COVID symptoms at home, they should <u>stay at home</u> and should book a PCR test, NOT a lateral Flow Test. If your child develops COVID symptoms at school, they will be sent home and you should book them a PCR test. If your child tests positive for COVID, they will need to self-isolate. The rest of the household does not need to self-isolate if they are under 18 or fully vaccinated – but instead should book a PCR test.

<p>Low Community Transmission. No School Cases</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There have been no cases of COVID within school for 10 days. Cases of COVID locally are low and/or stable. Hospitalisation/Deaths due to COVID nationally are low 	<p>No COVID measures are necessary beyond:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Reminding children of good-hygiene. Have regular centralised cleaning Ensuring good ventilation encouraged where practical Ensuring children/staff stay at home if they have COVID symptoms (and book a PCR test) <p>Staff will continue to test themselves using Lateral Flow Tests</p>
<p>Rapidly Rising Community Transition</p> 	<p>No current COVID cases have been recorded at school, but...</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Cases of COVID are rising rapidly in the community causing disruption to other local schools. Haringey Public Health/Public Health England issue warnings of expected local/national infection wave. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ventilation of classrooms increased and handwashing supervised. Large indoor public performances audience numbers reduced Staffroom capacity reduced Increase central internal cleaning Whole school assemblies are replaced by year group or virtual assemblies CV staff meet with line managers to review individual risk assessments and discuss additional protection (e.g. use of face coverings, reduction in movement between groups/classes) Reduce numbers eating in the dining room.

 <p>A single child tests positive</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A single child tests positive for COVID in a class • There are fewer than 5 cases in the year group/class • No other year groups affected 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The child self-isolates for 10 days. Remote learning will be provided if they are well enough to complete it as outlined here. • The parent of the child are contacted directly by NHS Track and Trace to establish likely contacts. • Likely contacts will be contacted by NHS Track & Trace and advised to book a PCR test. The school will contact parents to advise of positive cases and any known close contacts. • Children do not need to miss school or self-isolate whilst they wait for results of the PCR test unless they have COVID symptoms.
 <p>5 children or staff within a year group test positive within 10 days of each other.</p> <p>Or</p> <p>3 children or staff in a single class/club test positive within 10 days of each other</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There have been 5 cases of COVID across a year group within 10 days which could mean that COVID is spreading within that group of children. 	<p>As above for each positive case</p> <p>The school will discuss the outbreak with Haringey Public Health and agree strengthening protective measures for 10 school days, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Re-introduce staff face masks in corridors and communal areas ○ Adapting, limiting or postponing indoor events, sports, trips, visits, tours. ○ Reverting to video link assemblies for all children ○ Reducing the number of classes staff work across ○ Ask parents to wear masks when meeting with staff (if they are able) <p>(continue LFD testing)</p>
 <p>COVID cases continue to increase rapidly within a 10 day period</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Despite the measures indicated above, COVID cases within the school continue to rise within a 10 day period with multiple classes and staff affected, suggesting that COVID is spreading widely throughout the school. 	<p>Incident Management Team meeting held between the school and Haringey Public Health to agree further measures, for a further 10 days, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Re-introducing class bubbles ○ Reverting to class based lunches ○ Limiting non-essential visitors to school ○ Postponing non-essential events ○ Re-introduce route entrances to school – limit the footfall on school grounds. ○ Re-introduce remote learning for individual classes for 10 school days.

The school will inform parents of any changes to COVID measures, should these be needed.
