<p>Symptoms present:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a high temperature • a new persistent cough • a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste <p>Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.</p> <p>Child must not come into school if they have symptoms.</p> <p>Begin self-isolating. Other members of the household to begin self-isolating .</p> <p>Parent to book a test (booking centres are quicker than postal tests).</p> <p>Parent to notify school of the outcome of the test immediately.</p> <p>Negative test – if child feels well and no longer has symptoms similar to Covid-19 they can stop self-isolating. They could still have another virus, such as a cold or flu – in which case it is still best to avoid contact with other people until they are better. Other members of the household can stop self-isolating.</p> <p>Positive test - Child to continue to self-isolate for at least 10 days from the onset of their symptoms. Other members of their household should continue self-isolating for the full 14 days from the onset of the child’s symptoms. Child’s school pod and/or hub will close for 14 days following a positive corona test result.</p>	<p>Symptoms present:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a high temperature • a new persistent cough • a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste <p>Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.</p> <p>Child will be isolated in the Covid medical room until they are collected.</p> <p>Child must be sent home to self-isolate if they develop symptoms in school.</p> <p>Parent to book test (booking centres are quicker than postal tests). A limited number of tests may be available for schools to distribute to families unable to travel to testing centres.</p> <p>Parent to notify school of the outcome of the test.</p> <p>Parent to notify school of the outcome of the test immediately.</p> <p>Negative test – if child feels well and no longer has symptoms similar to Covid-19 they can stop self-isolating. They could still have another virus, such as a cold or flu – in which case it is still best to avoid contact with other people until they are better. Other members of the household can stop self-isolating.</p> <p>Positive test - Child to continue to self-isolate for at least 10 days from the onset of their symptoms. Other members of their household should continue self-isolating for the full 14 days. Child’s school pod and/or hub will close for 14 days following a positive corona test result. Parent to provide details of anyone the child has been in contact with if asked by NHS Test and Trace.</p>	<p>Child to continue to attend school as normal.</p> <p>Positive test for contact - child to begin self-isolation for 14 days. Child’s school pod and/or hub will close for 14 days.</p> <p>If child develops symptoms parent to immediately book a test at a local centre.</p> <p>Negative test for child – child must remain in isolation for 14 days from the onset of symptoms.</p> <p>Positive test for child - other members of the household to begin self-isolating. Child who has had positive test must self-isolate for 10 days from the onset of symptoms.</p>	<p>Child must not come into school.</p> <p>Parent to notify school.</p> <p>Wait for test of household member.</p> <p>Positive test of household member – child to self-isolate for 14 days.</p> <p>Negative test of household member – child to return to school.</p>	<p>NHS Test and Trace notifies child/parent.</p> <p>Parent to notify school.</p> <p>Child must not come into school.</p> <p>Child to begin self-isolation for 14 days. If child develops symptoms parent to book a test.</p> <p>Positive test for child - other members of the household to begin self-isolating. Child who has had positive test must self-isolate for 10 days from the onset of symptoms.</p>
