
Books

Diversity Initiative

In 2021, the school's strategic direction on race issues was defined by a revised inclusive curriculum across all year groups. We now plan to invite two inspiring professionals from Black groups/the African diaspora* each half term to speak at assemblies about their vocations and their professional journeys. In doing so, we hope to broaden our children's perspectives, and demonstrate the opportunities available to all of them and spotlight different roles played by ethnic minorities (thereby combating possible stereotypes). Our first invitee is Consultant Neurosurgeon at Addenbrookes Hospital, Mr Ibrahim Jalloh. This diversity initiative supports the school's recent work to restructure the curriculum to increase the representation of minority perspectives in school life. We would be keen to hear from any parents from Black groups/the African diaspora who would like to support this diversity initiative, either by speaking at assemblies themselves or by recommending inspiring professionals. Medication

We would like to remind parents that if your child needs to take medicine during the school day you will need to fill out a 'Permission to Administer Medication Form' which is available in the school office.

The medication needs to be in its original packaging with the pharmacist's label on with your child's name clearly marked on it. We are not able to administer medication unless it is a current prescription and has been prescribed by a GP or Hospital. Where we may be unsure we will need to check with our designated School Nurse.

Wherever possible please administer medication outside of school hours in accordance with the NHS quidelines:

'Most antibiotic medication will not need to be administered during school/setting hours. Twice daily doses should be given in the morning before school/setting and in the evening. Three times a day doses can normally be given in the morning before school/setting, immediately after (provided this is possible) and at bedtime. It should normally only be necessary to give antibiotics in school/setting if the dose needs to be given four times a day, in which case a dose is needed at lunchtime.'

Mental Health First Aid - message from our Mental Health First Aider

In order to support our staff's mental health and wellbeing further, we are wanting to run some workshops for staff to be able to take part in outside of school time.
